

Sophomore Advising Guide

The LSB sophomore advising guide is here to give recommendations of a road map for sophomores. We hope that you use this as a starting point to answer your questions. You can email lsb-peeradvisor@scu.edu if you have any questions.

1. Who do you go to for academic advising? Your Academic Advising Team:

- **Faculty Advisor**
 - i. If you are undeclared - you are assigned an undeclared faculty advisor which can be from any academic department in the business school
 - ii. If you declared your major - you will be assigned a faculty advisor within your major department
- **Sophomore Peer Advisors** are here to help you with selecting courses and course planning. Schedule an appointment or email questions at lsb-peeradvisor@scu.edu
- **Drahmann Center University Advisors** are a variety of faculty advisors who also provide academic advising on majors and minors. We recommend students who plan to double major to make an appointment with a Drahmann advisor. You can make an [online appointment](#) on their website.

2. Declare your Pathways and Major before spring mandatory advising to prevent a registration hold on your account.

- **Pathways** is a cluster of courses with a common theme, promoting integrative and intentional learning. You will submit a 2 page reflection essay your senior year. Begin using your upcoming courses to explore the Pathways you've identified. Continue to save your work!
 - i. Select your Pathway before May. [Declare Pathway through eCampus](#)
- **Declare your major.** You declare your major by filling out the [Program Petition form](#) on the Office of the Registrar website. If you want to change your major, you will use the Program Petition form. [Check out resources on choosing a major.](#)
